



### The Natural Choice

The Welsh Black is one of the most versatile breeds of cattle, having naturally evolved, moulded by the Welsh climate and terrain, making it one of the most naturally sustainable suckler possible. cows Historically the Welsh Black has been a cow that 'kept the family' not only producing top quality beef as it does today, but milk that was churned into butter and cheese, creating a sustainable income to support Welsh families generation after generation. This historical background gives the modern day Welsh Black the edge over its continental counterparts. It's no accident that the Welsh Black is docile, milky, hardy and produces top quality beef. It has evolved naturally over the millennia to be a truly sustainable animal.



### **Environmental Champion**

Bio-diversity and creating natural habitat for wildlife is one of the main benefits of grazing cattle. The Welsh Black is an animal that can thrive on lower quality forage, giving it an economical edge over most breeds. Some breeds are hardy, but struggle to produce a profitable end product, some breeds lack naturally produced milk, whilst other breeds simply won't make it where Welsh Blacks thrive. The Welsh Black can help create the sustainable habitat that is needed to tackle the current nature emergency, due to its foraging ability and less selective grazing habits, honed over the years so that it can flourish where others struggle. According to Rural Affairs Minister, Lesley Griffiths, the climate and nature emergencies pose "...the biggest medium to long term threat to food production in Wales." The answer is simple, return to the traditional breeds that sustained families and communities naturally over the centuries. The Welsh Black is the only cattle breed native to Wales.

### **Welfare Pioneers**

To be profitable a cow must first of all be healthy. One of the Welsh Black Cattle Society's main priorities is to promote health testing which will lead to higher standards of welfare, which in turn will lower the stress levels for both the cow and the farmer! The Society has a pioneering role in the field of cattle health, working hand in hand with the SAC to control Johne's disease, BVD and other major cattle health issues. The economic benefits of testing far outweigh the costs. The Society's vision is to promote an animal of high health status and full traceability.

This kind of cooperation with outside agencies alongside local vets is another link in the chain of social sustainability. **Social sustainability** has always been important in Wales and it could be argued that the agricultural community is an invaluable source to sustain Welsh culture and most of all the Welsh language.

# Technical Information · Gwybodaeth Technolegol TYPE CLASSIFICATION

LEARNING MORE ABOUT TYPE CLASSIFICATION AND THE BENEFITS.



Type Classification was set up over 50 years ago in order to identify the strengths and weaknesses in dairy cows. Although it was British Friesians that was the first breed that we started classifying all the other dairy breeds soon followed with more or less an identical system scoring similar traits.

The classification scheme has been a success story over many decades and has made a tremendous contribution to the improvement of herds both on type and production not only throughout the UK but throughout the world.

Some 7 or 8 years ago certain individuals involved in the breeding of both dairy and beef cattle thought that if classification had worked so well in the dairy world then why couldn't this be the case with beef cattle.

Beef Shorthorns was the first beef breed we started scoring closely followed by the Simmentals and we now classify a total of 8 dairy breeds and 11 beef breeds including the Welsh Blacks. There are another 2 breeds showing an interest. Some 3 of all the breeds we now score are dual purpose.

When scoring suckler cows we break them down into 4 main boxes being:

### **BODY CONFORMATION**

which makes up 25% of the final score

### **BEEF CHARACTER**

which also takes into account Breed Character, this box also makes up 25% of the final score

### LEGS + FEET

this important box has a weighting of 30% of the final score

### MAMMARY

has a weighting of 20% of the final score.

When scoring suckler cows we break them down into 4 main boxes being:

These 4 composite boxes are made up of different Linear Traits which are measured on a 1 to 9 scale.

Without going into too much detail and complicating the whole issue breeders and farmers simply need to remember that the 4 composite boxes are never scored in the high eighties and over ninety unless the linear traits are fairly close to ideal.

Where as so many indexes is a prediction, classification is actual and I believe that is why they both work well together as a management tool for breeding more profitable long living cows.

One of the many benefits of classification is when buying a future Stock Bull at a Society Sale, which is a very important task, the buyer can see the classification of the mother and sometimes 3 or 4 generations.

I personally believe that the cow family needs to be at least in the high VG's which means the high eighties and into EX which means 90 and above. If you have a problem in your herd for example with legs + feet then you need a bull from a cow family with a high score well over 90 in legs + feet to improve them, not a bull from a cow that has a high score in the 3 other boxes but perhaps VG 88 in Legs + Feet, whereas if you have really good legs + feet in your herd and need to improve udders then that particular bull may be ideal.

Some of the other benefits include identifying the best females in your herds to breed replacements and of course cows that are scored the highest points more often than not make the highest prices at sales if you sell them.

Another strength of the classification system is that we can always change the traits we score and change the weightings of the composite boxes if the need arises, so that we continue improving the herd if certain new weaknesses creep into the breed.

The Welsh Black is an exceptional good suckler cow and always a good mother, whether on the hills or on the lowlands she does her calf well because the breed is noted for having plenty of milk which means that whether you breed them pure or cross them with other breeds the story will be a success.

We would like to wish them all the best with their new herd.








# Steps to collect

# DNA Testing









Gather between 40-50 hairs, and grasp them tightly as close to the skin as possible, avoiding hairs with manure.

Pull the hair slowly and firmly away from the tail, making sure to get the roots

Place the sample on the card placing the roots of the hair on the top square and sticker over the bottom square.

Return the sample to the Society Office with the animals UK number and Pedigree name on a separate piece of paper.

# MYOSTATIN DNA TESTING

Knowing the genetics in your herd can help you maximise the returns and minimise the undesirable affects.

# The different variants can give you differnet results:

Double muscling and increased muscularity

Large birth weight

Meat tenderness

Increased calving difficulty

Rescue external and intramuscular fat

**Reduce milk production** 

The mysotatin gene influences the muscle development and the mutation in the gene can affect the control of muscle growth which can lead to increased muscle mass -double muscling.

The myostatin gene also influences the production of a protein that controls the development of muscle in cattle. There are nine known variants of the gene with four being predominantly found in the UK namely E226X, F94L, Q204X and nt821.

Some of the variants can be linked to larger calf birth weights, resulting in calving difficulty. Some of these variants are also linked to reduced milk yield, delayed puberty and reduced fertility in females. There are however some benefits to the gene with increased killing out percentage, improved conformation and increased meat tenderness.





## Buches DYFNANT Herd

Aberdyfnant is situated on the edge of the Brecon Beacons National Park (Bannau Brycheiniog) Carmarthen Fans.

The farm is 250 acres with an additional 150 acres rented seasonally, ranging from 700 – 1200 ft. The Thomas family keeps 30 head plus followers of Welsh Black Cattle (all kept pure) and 1000 breeding ewes, mostly Brecknock Hill Cheviots.

The Welsh Black cow is an ideal suckler cow with a quiet temperament, hardy, good mothers with plenty of milk off the grass, and can be easily outwintered.

The family established the Dyfnant herd and started keeping Welsh Black in 1998 after purchasing Brysgaga Menna from Llandovery Pedigree Sale. The herd has grown from strength to strength purchasing Neuadd, Hafodesgob, Cerdin, Wye, and Gwerncernyddion bloodlines.

Previous stock bulls include, Neuadd Hebog, Caerynwch Major, Llechwedd Egrynwr a Trefaes Twm. While current stock bulls at the Dyfnant herd include Llechwedd Rhys, Nantrhys Adda, and Trefeas Blewgi.

Dyfnant Herd heifers are sold either incalf or as maiden heifers at Society Sales at Dolgellau and Monmouth, while the steers are sold at 20–22 months old at the Dolgellau Welsh Black Spring store sale. Bulls from the herd are sold at the Society January Sale in Dolgellau, and the family is always open to selling stock privately.

The Dyfnant herd participates in the Johne's and BVD health schemes.

The family has won numerous prizes at the South Wales Welsh Black Herd Competition and has won overall 'Herd of the Year' on many occasions.

#### **DATHLU 50 MLYNEDD!**

Celebrating 50 years both with the Society and achieving pure polled status.

'Ni'n yma o hyd' - yng ngheiriau fy ngefnder.

My wife and I purchased Cefn Don in 1972, primarily as a nice place to live when our son was young. We purchased pedigree Welsh Black cattle that was suitable for the farm, together with a polled bull, because even in 1973 horns were surplus to requirements. I went to the far end of the Llyn Peninsula for Twyn Dewi. He was big, long and quiet and cost £500: a lot of money then when society membership was £3.15 per annum. He was used by us on horned cows from Caerbellan and Neuadd amongst others as not many polled females were on the market.

The Society's polled register was opened in 1956, which listed animals born as far back as the 1940s. Amongst prominent breeders of the time were Captain Bennett- Evans Llangurig, Miss Frances Evans Tregaron, Gwilym Owen Rhiwgoch and the Ministry at the Plant Breeding Station Morfa Mawr.



This was a time at the end of the period that the legendary Gwilym Edwards was in charge of the Society and the Society employed 10 people in Caernarfon.

Our cattle breeding started just in time to experience the drought of 1976, which sharpened our learning curve markedly. I became a Council member in 1976 and the herd expanded. This was encouraged by the subsidy being paid on a headage basis and we calved 131 pedigree cows in 1990

It has always been our policy to run a pedigree herd on a commercial basis. There was a ready market for surplus heifers, steers were more problematic. We then decided to keep male calves entire and enjoyed a good trade as bull beef in Cowbridge market along side the new continental breeds that were appearing at the time. We continue to keep all male calves entire to this day.



Foot and Mouth affected us in 2001 and we lost about half of the herd that was away on Summer grazing. Luckily we were left with the younger animals which were at home. The herd achieved Johnnes free status in 2004 and remains so. with Gold Standard for BVD.

#### **OUR PLAN FOR IMPROVEMENT**

Early in our breeding we discovered the occasional 'double muscled' calf which appears from time to time in Welsh Black cattle and in other breeds. We are all producing meat which is mostly muscle, so I thought that 'double muscle' seemed a good idea. We were weight recording at the time with MLC where potential bull calves could be sent to their premises at Home Lacey at about 5 months of age. They would be monitored and halter broken, weight recorded and returned to breeders after being evaluated by 3 eminent judges from the Society. Sadly, our double muscled bull scored 15/100 on the basis that he did not look like a Welsh Black. As we were intending to improve our herd, it seemed to me that improving meant changing and we have used myostatin variants together with weight recording with SAC cautiously over the years to produce the results that we have today.

We have a tight calving pattern, some in Spring and a second group in the Autumn. Our replacement heifers go to the bull at around 14 / 15 months of age having reached a weight of at least 420kg. All bull calves are kept entire and those not kept as breeding bulls are sold at Ludlow

Market weighing around 570-600kg at about 15 months of age.

Calves with the best genetic potential for growth reach about 600kg at 12 months and 650kg 400 day weights are not unknown.

Ludlow Market on a Monday is arguably the best market in the UK for finished bulls of all breeds. It was particularly pleasing that in November 2021 one of our pedigree Welsh Black bulls achieved the top price per KG for all bulls on that day.

The major development for cattle breeding was when the full genome became available commercially. This reveals the genetic makeup of an animal from a hair sample, whether an animal has any myostatin variant and the type as well as the polled status. The Society's polled rules were rewritten in 2015 to reflect the new technology and it was said at the time that the Welsh Black breed now had the polled rules other breeds aspire to.

Opinion is varied amongst breeders as to the merit of using myostatin variants so the testing allows us to offer our pure polled bulls with or with out myostatin variant and with the variant of choice.





Planning is underway for hosting the UK's 5th World Conference in July 2024 to coincide with the Royal Welsh Show Week

#### 21st - 28th July 2024 (8 days)

This will be a shortened visit where it is hoped that we can attract a superb number of entries to the Show, followed by 2 or 3 farm visits on Friday and Saturday.

# Newyddion o'r ALMAEN

2022 was a very eventful and successful year for the Welsh Black breeders in Germany.

Every two years the National Show of Welsh Black Cattle takes place in Germany, where breeders from all over Germany present their most beautiful cattle. In 2022 the time had come again and the Federal Show was held this time in Erfurt on 23 to 24 September 2022.

Judging took place in three categories: cow with calf, bulls and heifers.

In the category cow with calf the Michaelis family won with their cow RM Brasilia (Sony daughter) and her Jeti son. In this category the Mahnken family came second with their cow Lexi (Endrik daughter) which had a calf (Sidney daughter) with her.

The next category of heifers, the Michaelis family celebrated their second great success in Erfurt as their heifer RM Batida (Mandera daughter) won against all other young cattle.

The national reserve victory in the category heifers was celebrated by the Schröter family with their young heifer Elise (Benji daughter).

In the last category were the bulls. The bull Graig vom Murrteich (Berwyn son) from the Eckert farm could decide the federal victory for himself.

Also in this category Jörg Schröter won the Federal Reserve Champion with his bull Bruno (Bedwyr son).

But not only the beautiful black cattle could show their best side but also our young breeders.

Together with the German Galloway Breeders' Association, a young breeders' competition took place at the Green Days in Erfurt, where the Welsh Black young breeders were able to assert themselves strongly.

Karl Burchardt and his young cow FB Mabel won the young breeders' competition in the youngest group together with two Galloway young breeders.

The Welsh Black young breeders in the middle age group also won the placings.

In the middle age group Johann Harms could win the reserve title with his cattle RM Happy and Romy Hacke could win with her young cattle Phantasy vom Murrteich.

The Welsh Black young breeders also won in the oldest age group.

Anna Schaate won with her heifer Abbey vom Murrteich and Victoria Burchardt with her cow FB Kaja and calf won the reserve title.



Another highlight for the young breeders was the German National Young Breeders Competition for beef cattle on 09.09 to 11.09.2022.

At this competition in Bad Sassendorf, 3 Welsh Black young breeders started with cattle from Hacke family.

In this competition the young breeders did not only show their talent in handling the cattle by presenting their heifers, but also in judging the appearance of the cattle of different breeds.

In the ranking competition Romy Hacke wom the 3rd place in the group medium and the first place in the animal judgement, also Anna Schaate took 2nd place. In the demonstration competition Romy Hacke and her heifer Naomi won the first place in their class. The next Welsh Black young breeder was Charlotte Leussner with her young heifer Jette. Despite strona competition, they both took second place in their class. The last of our young breeders on this day was Anna Schaate who came third with her heifer Juli. To crown it all, a Grand Champion was chosen in each of the three age groups. And also here our young breeder Romy Hacke could dominate and was crowned Grand Champion of this competition in the age group middle.

As a club we offer something for all our members, and again we held a photography competition last Autumn, organised by Victoria Burchardt. It was a great pleasure to see not only German breeders taking part in this competition but also breeders from the United Kingdom and Australia. In 2023 there will be another photo competition and we are looking forward to a large participation from outside Germany.





#### Welsh Black Scheme Requirements

- The sire of cattle presented must be a registered Welsh black bull.
- Cattle must have been grazing for a minimum of 6 months and received a minimum of 50% forage in their diet on a fresh weigh basis at all other times.
- Details of any bought in feed containing soya must be provided.
- A supply forecast must also be provided to help ensure a consistent supply.
- Cattle must be between 260-380kg deadweight and a weight premium will be paid depending on weight band within this.
- · Carcasses must be within fat classes 3, 4L & 4H.

#### Additional Scheme Premiums are available for cattle that meet 1 or more of the following:

- · Cattle under 24 months.
- Supply of antibiotic usage data in the herd for a minimum of 12 months.
- · Cattle that are booked in at least 3 months in advance.

Participating producers must be Members (£60 a year) or Associate Members (£30 a year) of the Welsh Black Cattle Society



## PELVIC MEASURING HEIFERS

WHAT IS PELVIC SCORING AND HOW VALUABLE IS IT FOR CALVING?







#### What is pelvic scoring?

Pelvic scoring is used to help identify any heifer with a small or abnormally shaped pelvis. The score is calculated by taking internal measurements of the height and width of the pelvis using a Rice pelvimeter.


Vets carefully introduce the pelvimeter into the rectum with a gloved, lubricated arm and guide the rounded ends of the pelvimeter arms to the skeletal landmarks for measurement.

The internal height is measured by depressing the levers, so the ends of the grooved arm sit between the symphysis pubis and the sacral vertebrae.

The height measurement is read off the external (cm) scale and recorded.

The internal width is then taken by rotating the pelvimeter horizontally.

The measurement is taken from the widest point of the pelvis, at the level of the paos tubercles.



#### How is the score calculated and what do the values mean?

The pelvic area (sq cm) is calculated by multiplying the recorded height and width.

Typically, a value smaller than 130sq cm may not be suitable. However, where a heifer is being examined before the service period, the age and weight should be recorded on the same day as the pelvic scoring and considered alongside the calculation.

Using "LeFever's (1997) calf birthweight ration conversion chart system" (below), look up the age and weight of the heifer to give a conversion factor.

The pelvic area should be divided by this number to give an estimated value of the body weight (kg) of a calf that the heifer should be able to deliver without difficulty.

Where this value is unrealistically small, delivery of a normal-sized calf is likely to prove difficult and the heifer should not be kept to avoid this situation.

For example, if the heifer is 12-13 months, weighs 272kg, and has a pelvic value of 120sq cm, divide 120 by 2.1. This means she would be capable of delivering a 57kg calf.



#### How should the results be used to inform breeding decisions?

A heifer with a small or abnormally shaped pelvis should not be bred from.

When RTS is combined with pelvic scoring, it is easier to predict the chance of pregnancy failure and poor cyclicity.

It is important to interpret pelvic scores alongside reproductive tract measurements to avoid breeding from potentially unproductive heifers.

Early-cycling heifers are more likely to get in-calf quicker, so they have a better chance of timely rebreeding and are more likely to rear heavier weaned calves.

Beef farmers should still retain heifers from their best, most efficient cows, as well as keeping those with good conformation, a suitably sized external frame, and docile nature.


